The Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the most important moment in the history of creation, truly revealing to us how close God is. Nothing can separate us from the love of God. But we choose, through sin, to look away and to overlook him at work in our lives and world.

Lent is a season in which we look into ourselves, asking God to help us amend our ways, to turn more fully towards him, and to prepare ourselves to witness the events of Holy Week. The more fully we engage with Lent, the more glorious our Easter celebrations will be. Each one of us individually, and all of us as a community as well.

If you are reading this as a member of the congregation at St Clement's, do commit this year to entering into the mystery and spirit of Lent. If you are reading this from elsewhere, and especially if you are asking questions about life, death, faith, love... Lent is a perfect time to delve into the Church and see what it's all about.

Alongside all the special events and services listed in this booklet, we continue to worship every Sunday at 8:00am (quiet, said Holy Communion c30 minutes) and 10:30am (sung Parish Eucharist c75 minutes), Wednesdays at 10:00am (Holy Communion c30 minutes), Fridays at 9:45am (Morning Prayer, 15 minutes), and other times as announced.

Tuesday 31st March 6:00pm-7:00pm

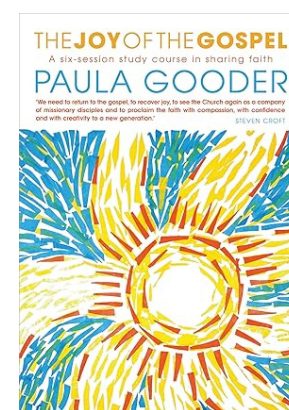
What happens to the bread and wine? A Eucharist celebrated with commentary on why we celebrate it and what it means.

THIS EASTER AT SAINT CLEMENT'S...

Around 1869, the east wall behind the high altar was paved with beautiful tiles featuring flowers, anchors, and a central cross. **The whole wall was whitewashed over** in 1913. We have begun the process of removing the whitewash to reveal this splendid wall, ready to be unveiled during the **Easter Vigil (Saturday 4th April 2026 at 8:00pm)**, in the full glory of the light of the Resurrection.

To celebrate the restoration of the tiles, and to ensure the continued life of St Clement's, we invite you to sponsor a tile.
